## **POPULATION SCHEDULES:**

Every 10 years starting in 1790 (up to 1940 available)

## **SPECIAL SCHEDULES (agricultural, mortality, slave):**

1810, 1820, and systematically between 1850 and 1930

**The special schedules for 1810, 1890, and post-1900 are mostly destroyed; the National Archives microfilm collection covers only 1850 to 1880.**

**Generally speaking,  
the further back you go,  
the less information is available.**

**1830**

- 🔗 **first to use printed forms**

**1840**

- 🔗 **first to ask if person was a Revolutionary War pensioner or pensioner's widow**

**1850**

- **first to name every non-slave resident**
  - **first to use slave schedules**

**1860**

- **has suffered the most damage and loss apart from the 1890**

**1870**

- 👤 **first to ask whether parents were foreign- or native-born**
- 👤 **first to attempt a listing of *everyone* in the population**

**1880**

- 👤 **first to list street names and house numbers, marital status, and how residents of a household were connected**

**1890**

- 👤 first to ask about Civil War service**
- 👤 first to ask for racial self-identification**
- 👤 only one to ask whether person was “defective”  
in mind, body, sight, hearing, or speech**



**The information was recorded by enumerators on preprinted sheets and shipped to Washington for copying to clean pages, which were used to tabulate results.**

**After copying and tabulation, the sheets and notes were boxed up and stored on open shelves in the Commerce Department basement.**



**No other copy of this record set existed.**

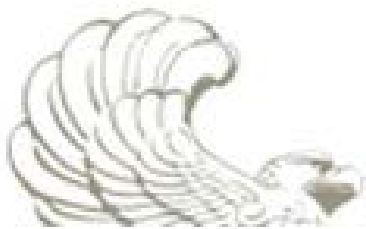

## 1900

- only one to ask for month and year of birth
- first to ask how many children each woman had borne, and of those, how many were living
- first to ask year of arrival, if not a natural-born citizen, and current citizenship status

## **1903: Census Bureau created**

### **1910**

- first to ask where in the naturalization process each foreign-born person was**
- asked whether individual was a Civil War veteran**

### **1920**

- asked year of naturalization for foreign-born**

## 1930

- 👤 only one to ask “age at first marriage”
- 👤 only one to ask whether household possessed a radio

## 1940

- 👤 only one to ask where people had lived five years previously
- 👤 only one to ask highest level of school completed

**1940**

**ALSO the only one that indicates WHO gave the information to the census-taker (look for an asterisk).**

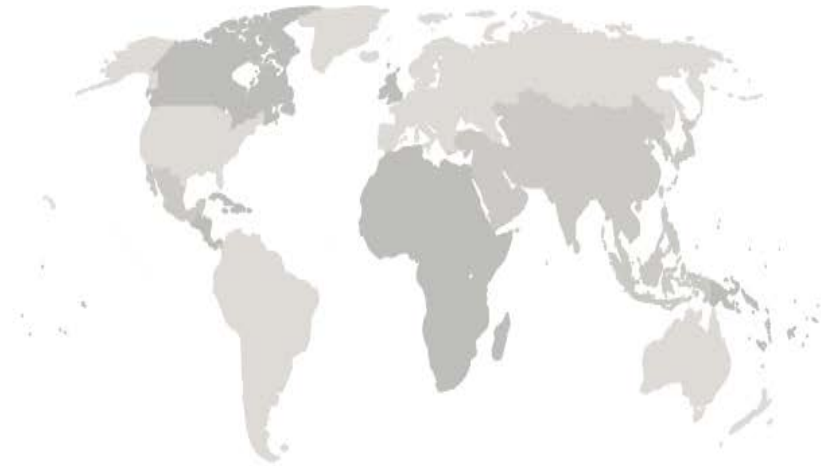



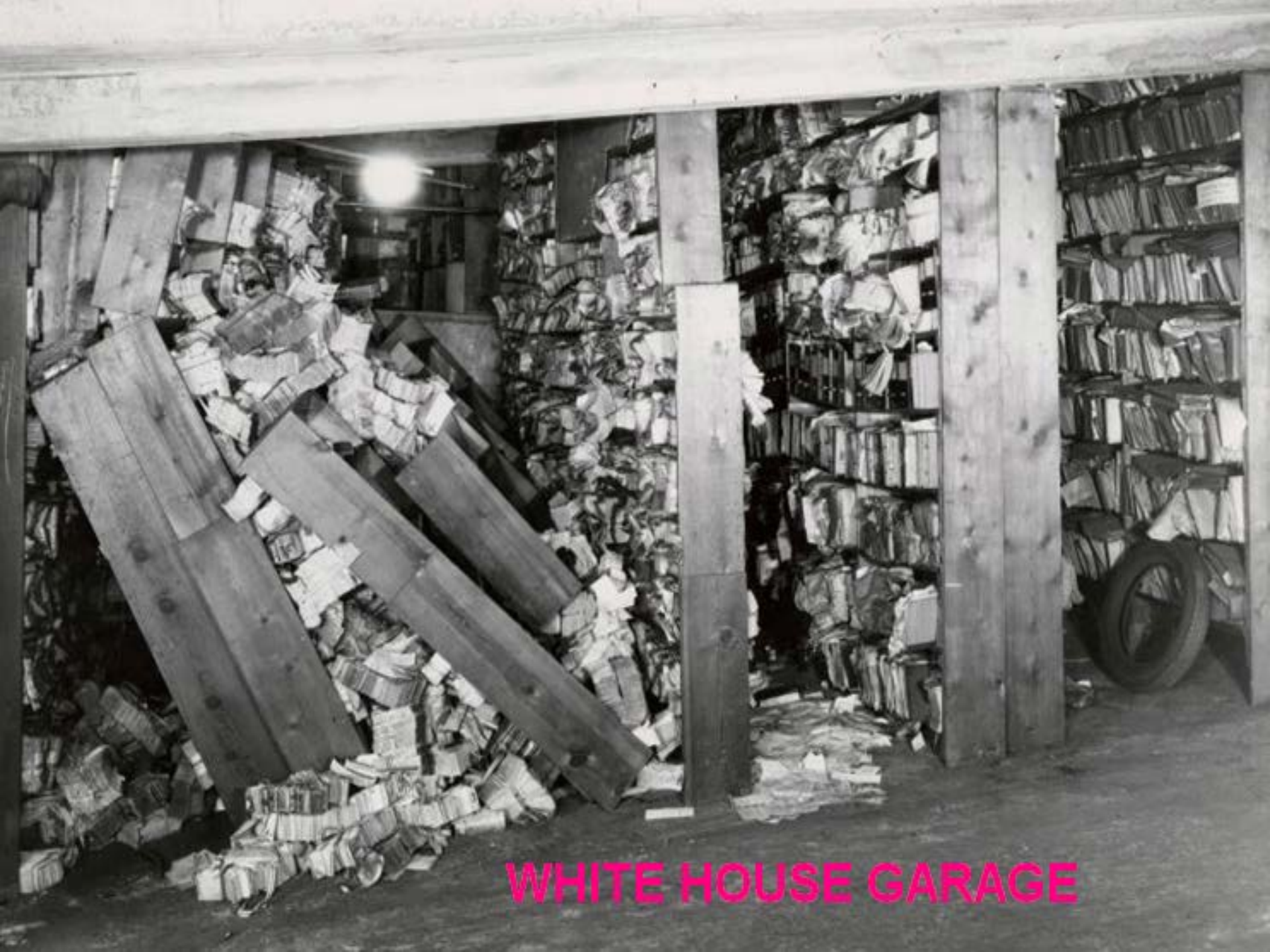

# Use Search Terms Wisely

## CASE STUDY:

You want to find census records for John McKay, who was born in Philadelphia in 1904.

If you enter **Philadelphia** as birth place in the search form, you won't retrieve anything because the census only lists *states* and *countries* as birth places.

**Bottom line:** Know what data points are in the records you are searching.

# Look Beyond the Target's Name

**BE CREATIVE!**

Pull up records for all the males born in Kentucky around 1902 to a mother named Emily, or for all females born in Tennessee around 1910 to a father who was born in Texas.

**Ancestry and FamilySearch both let you do this kind of searching.**

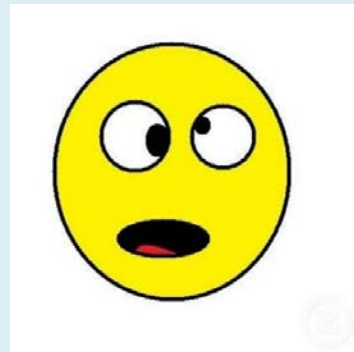

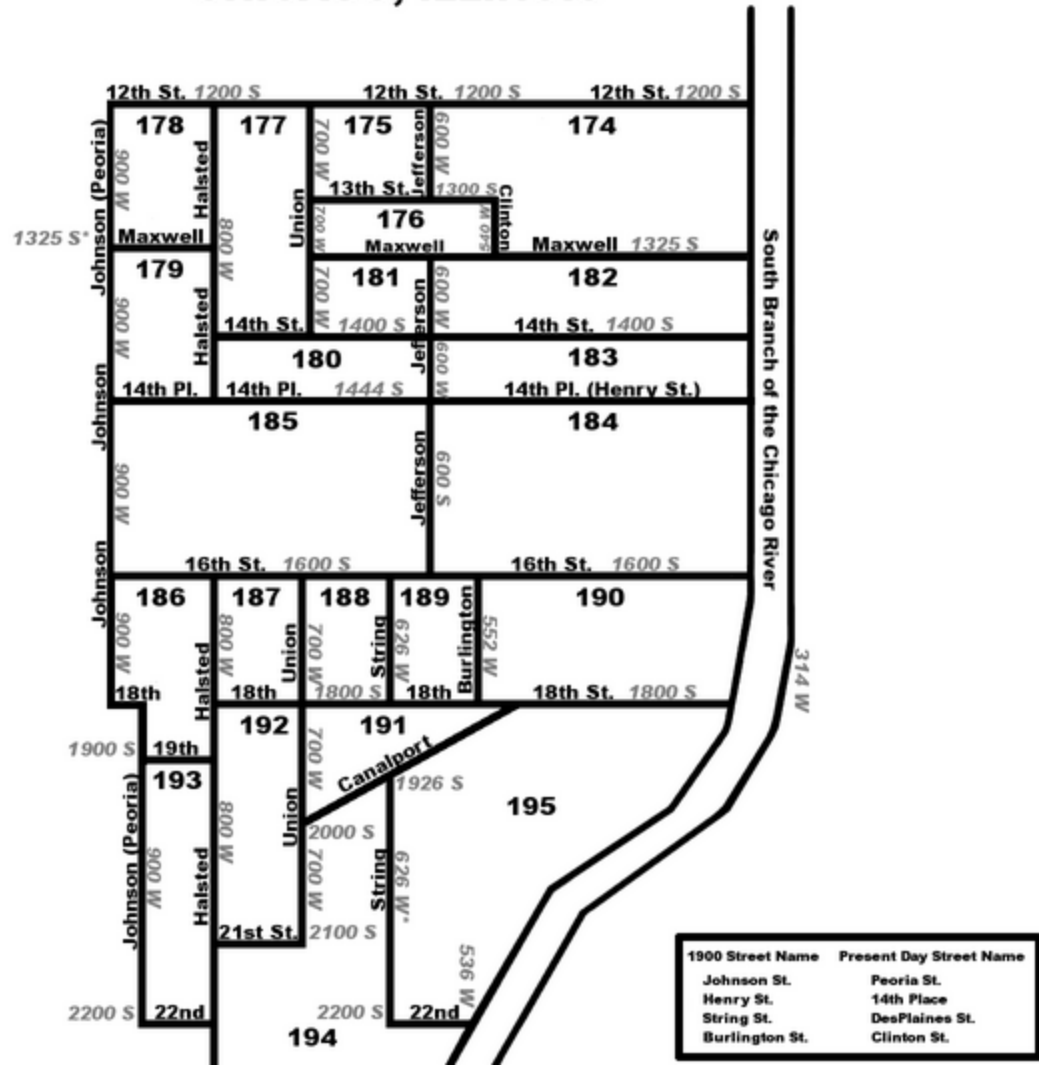

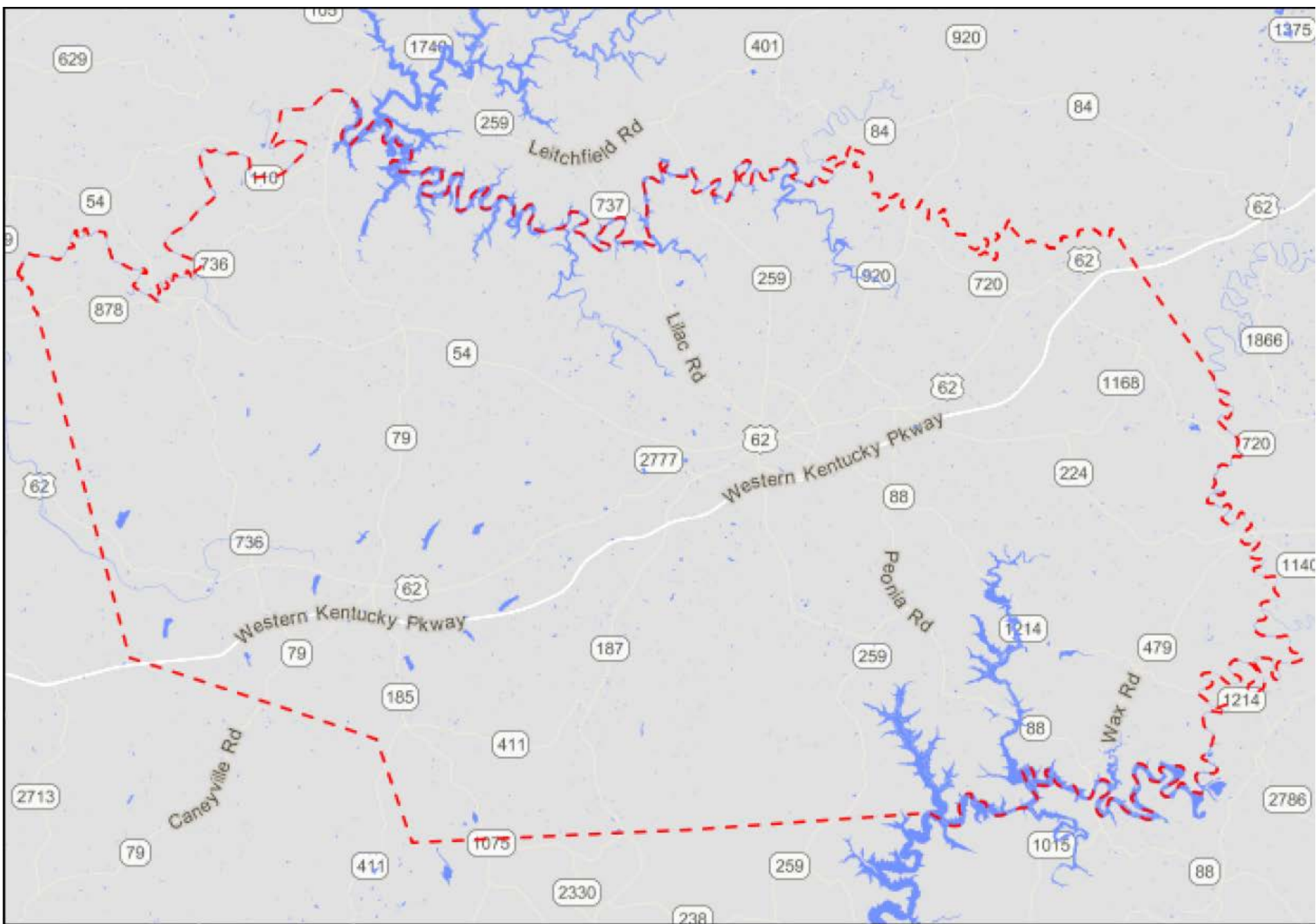

Special federal non-population schedules (censuses conducted for a purpose other than counting the entire U.S. population) can be an untapped gold mine for family historians. Agricultural, manufacturing, and mortality censuses may provide information on recently deceased individuals, or fascinating details of an ancestor's occupation. Other special censuses enumerated slaves, military veterans and their widows, Native Americans, and even deaf couples.

### Mortality Schedules

Special schedules called [mortality schedules](#) were conducted in conjunction with the regular population census to record information about individuals who died during the twelve months prior to the census. If the census was taken on 1 June 1850, the enumerator would ask if anyone in the household had died between 1 June 1849 and 31 May 1850, and would gather information on name, age, sex, color, marital status, birthplace, occupation, month of death and cause of death. With few exceptions, mortality schedules survive only for the census years of 1850, 1860, 1870 and 1880.

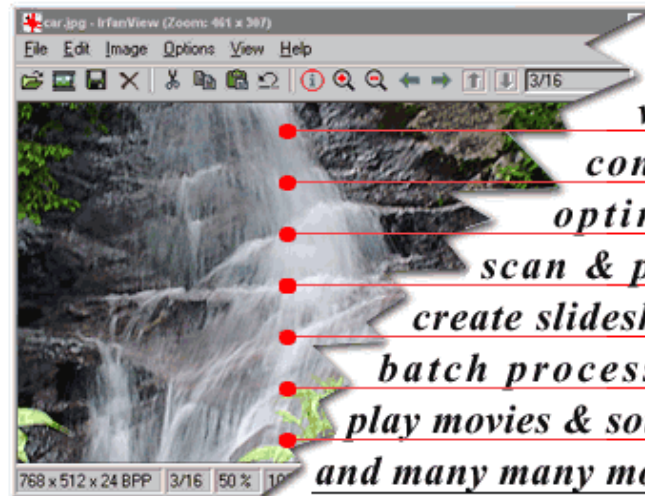

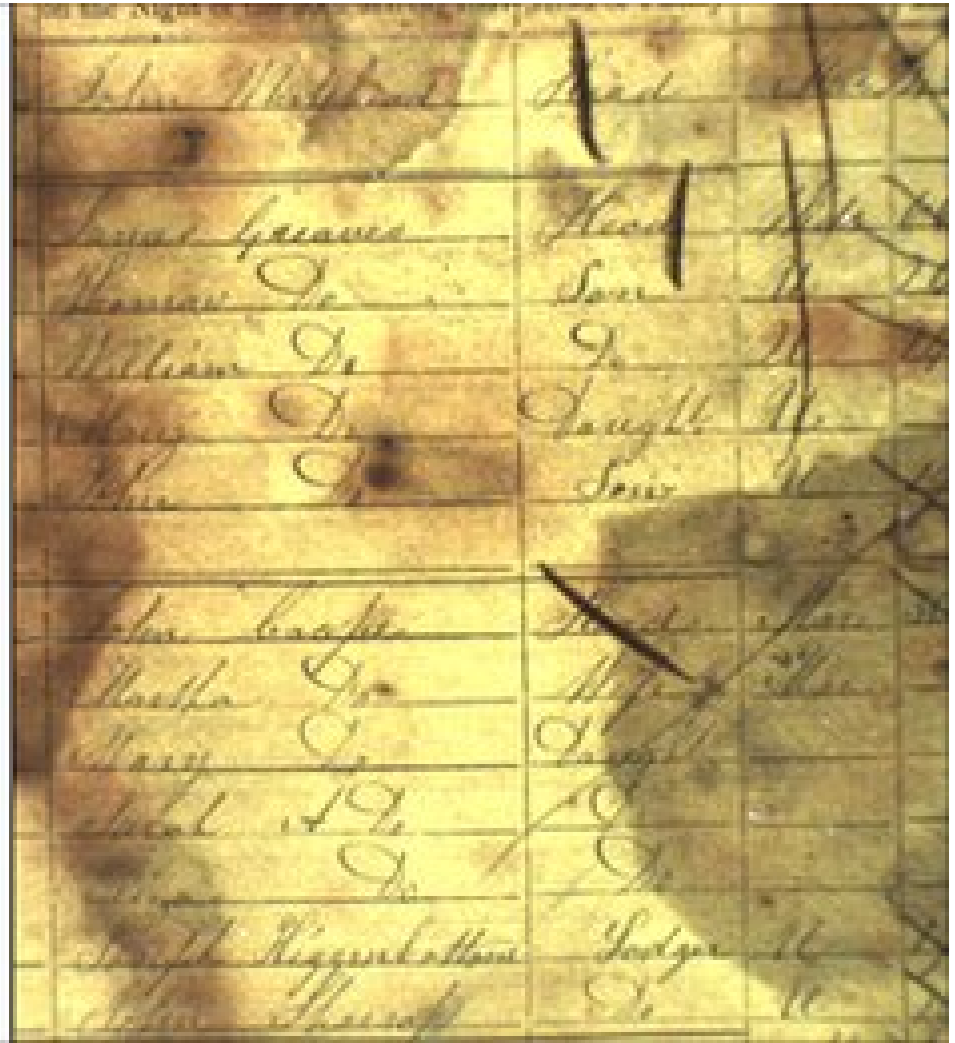
