Discover These and Other Programming Resources @ the State Library

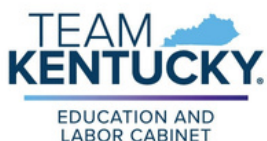
The State Library offers numerous adult and youth book discussion kits, as well as programming kits, in a variety of genres and themes.

Book discussion kits include copies of the book (up to 15 for adult kits and 20 for youth), an audiobook when available, and a discussion guide. Some youth book kits also include a large print and/or Spanish copy of the title.

Programming kits encourage kids and adults to explore, create, and learn. These kits contain many developmentally appropriate materials—books, CDs, DVDs, electronics, games or toys, and resource guides.

Anyone residing in Kentucky can make use of our kits, including schoolteachers and school librarians, homeschooling parents, community book clubs, colleges, and other public and private institutions. However, all kits must be reserved by a local Kentucky public library staff member (exceptions considered on a case-by-case basis).
