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Recap of the 2024 Archives Institute

The theme was disaster preparedness and recovery. Speakers included Sara Holmes, a conservationist who provided an informative talk as well as a hands-on disaster recovery activity; Nancy Richey, a professor from Western Kentucky University who discussed at-home records preservation; and Derek Clark, the Electronic Records Branch Manager from KDLA who spoke about digital

State-Issued Naturalization Records Now Available in the KSDA!

The Electronic Records Branch have digitized our Naturalization records as part of a grant from the National Historical Publications and Records Commission, and they are now available in the Kentucky State Digital Archives. Prior to becoming a federal process, immigrants could submit petitions to Kentucky courts to initiate the process. We now have these materials for 30 counties available, and they include indexing, Petitions for Naturalization, Declarations of Intention, and more digitized from the originals and micrographic copies held at KDLA.

Electronic Records Branch Staff Attend New Event

Derek Clark and Elainé Gollihue from KDLA's Electronic Records Branch attended the Digital Preservation Coalition's Members Forum and Networking Event at Vanderbilt University. This was the group's first event in the U.S., and the program contained sessions on topics ranging from web archiving to assessment models.
