The thirty-seventh annual Kentucky Archives Institute, sponsored by the Friends of Kentucky Public Archives, Inc., was held at the Kentucky Department for Libraries and Archives (KDLA) on July 14, 2023. Participants enjoyed a program of interesting and informative presentations focusing on African American genealogy research. Hillary Delaney from the Boone County Public Library began the day with "African American & Underground Railroad Research in Antebellum Kentucky Records (and beyond)." Daniele Celano with the Kentucky Historical Society presented on "Return Not Executed: Court Documents and the Paper Trail of Freedom-Seekers." The afternoon featured sessions from Sharyn Mitchell, Co-Founder of the African American Genealogy Group of Kentucky (AAGGKY), who spoke on "Black History: It's Around Here Somewhere – History of the African American Genealogy Group of KY and Challenges Faced When Researching Black History", and Jerry Bedford, Jr., AAGGKY President, presented on "DNA: Surprise, Surprise!!!"

A gubernatorial proclamation from Governor Andy Beshear signaled the importance of this annual event.




#### Thank You, Roger Hamperian

#### **KDLA Wraps Up NHPRC Grant**

The Archives and Records Management (ARM) Division is finishing up its work on the National Historical Publications and Records Commission (NHPRC) grant-funded project "Early Court Cases and State-Granted Naturalizations." All digitization of Kentucky General Court cases (1799-1850) and state-issued Naturalizations (1820-1945) has been completed, and those scans are currently being ingested into the Kentucky State Digital **Archives** (KSDA). collections will be available to the public in the KSDA soon.






#### KDLA Archives Research Room Supervisor Reunion
