2022 programming ideas:

75 years ago (1947)

- [Jackie Robinson](#) becomes the first Black baseball player to play in the American Major Leagues in the 20th century. The Baseball Commissioner at the time was Kentucky's [Albert 'Happy' Chandler](#). Display library materials about Jackie Robinson, baseball, African Americans and baseball, and the integration of professional or college sports. See if there are people in your community who may be willing to do a presentation about the integration of professional or amateur sports.
- Anne Frank's [The Diary of a Young Girl](#) is published. Consider a discussion or a display related to refugees, those affected by war, and the relief efforts and organizations, like [Kentucky Refugee Ministries](#) and the [Red Cross](#), that exist. Your community members may be interested in volunteering or learning more about these organizations.
- The [National Security Act of 1947](#) is signed, creating the Central Intelligence Agency and the National Security Council. Display library materials related to espionage and intelligence, including the Bourne Trilogy and James Bond films. Don't forget to highlight the [career opportunities that exist in the intelligence field, too.](#)
- [FERRARI 125 S](#) is the first car to have the name Ferrari. Incorporate this information into a display about sports cars. You may also want to highlight Kentucky's role in the automobile industry.
- The world's first computer bug [is found](#) on September 9, 1947. Have a display with library materials about computer programming, and include titles about Grace Hopper, a member of the team who discovered the bug. This is also a good time to highlight job opportunities in the [computer, engineering, and technology](#) fields.
- [India gains its independence from Great Britain](#) Display any library materials about India, including its history, food, culture, and any novels. The following KDLA book kits have titles which reference India. Use [KDLA's kit request form](#) to request one of these kits for your library, and you'll have a book discussion program planned.
