



Becoming a Genre Expert

- Keep a reading journal


- Locate non-library blogs
















ARRT Popular Fiction List

Mystery = Puzzle

Characteristics

- Involves a crime, usually murder
- Investigated and culprit brought to justice
- Focus on central puzzle and/or character development
- Wide range of detectives and types of mystery

Fan Popularity

- Like to solve the puzzle before the detective
- Like that good and justice triumphs in the end
- Some cover social issues
- Blends well with other genres
- Like elaborate backgrounds
- Appreciate range of toneshumor, moody, evocative

- Psychological suspense
- Classics reissues and rediscoveries
- International authors and settings
- Use of actual historical personages as detectives
- Historical mysteries
- U.S. regional mysteries



How do I help mystery fans?

- Ask readers to describe the detective they like to read about for clues to the kind of mystery to suggest
- Use television shows or movies from books to find similar titles
- No two people have the same definition of the genre
- Suggest cozies for readers looking for mysteries with minimal violence
- First title in series not always the best place to start





Thrillers = Anticipation

Characteristics

- Action-driven stories
- See both hero and villain viewpoints
- Sense of menace builds to dramatic climax
- Pacing important
- Story takes place in short time frame

Fan Popularity


- Sympathetic heroes and heroines / deadly villains
- Conspiracies
- Learn about inner workings of profession
- Twisting story lines
- Good and bad clearly defined
- Justice done by the end
- Cinematic scope

- Historical thrillers and suspense, especially featuring World Wars I & II
- Technology plays bigger role
- Forensics important
- Tales of terrorists and conspiracies
- More international settings and characters
- Supernatural plays bigger role

How can I help thriller/suspense readers?

- May confuse thrillers, suspense and mysteries
- Use movies as starting place to find similar plots in books
- Offer range in amount of sex and violence
- Covers reveal clues that can be used in booktalks or RA interview





Fantasy = Imagination

Characteristics

- Takes intuitive approach
- Deals with emotions and relationships
- · Preserves familiar stories, legends and myths
- Good vs. Evil battles
- Characters may have special gifts
- Elaborate detailed settings

Fan Popularity

- · Contains wide range of characters, storylines, and tones to match moods
- Contains wide range of tones from humorous to gritty
- Familiar stories with a twist
- Male and female protagonists

Current Trends


- Dark and gritty urban stories
- Alternate history
- Genre mash-ups
- Fantasy graphic novels
- Game, film and television adaptations



How can I help fantasy readers?

- Catalog by series rather than author
- Blends with other genres
- Inquire about mood and tone
- Recommend classic fantasy titles, titles that span conventional age designations and titles of short story collections
- Have all titles in series on hand





Science Fiction = What if?

Characteristics

- Considers moral, social, and ethical issues while exploring philosophical, technical, and intellectual questions
- Often in a setting outside own world or in a future time
- Stories contain science supported by known scientific principles

Fan Popularity

- Filled with physical and intellectual adventure
- Appeals to wide range of readers
- Raises thought-provoking issues
- Deals with "why" and "where" questions
- Cherishes the unexpected
- Affirms imagination

- Increase in alternate history and timelines



How can I help SF readers?

- Listen to patrons for feedback
- Use movies and books to find what appeals to readers
- Suggest classic sci-fi authors
- Catalog under series title rather than authors
- Acquire paperbacks and short story collections
- Reach out to tweens and teens
- Cross genre blending
- Multiple formats—graphic novels, e-books, audiobooks, media (games, television, movies)





Horror = Fear

Characteristics


- Feature nightmares come to life
- Monsters can be human, inhuman, and psychological
- Surprise a key element
- Evil beaten down, but never destroyed completely

Fan Popularity


- Love the chills produced
- Expect to be scared
- Drawn to intensity created by disturbing images and violence
- Like worlds out of control
- Can face worst fears in safe environment

Current Trends

- "Weird Fiction"
 - Blends occult, supernatural, mythical and even scientific elements
- Comic Horror
- Blending with other genres
- Greater prominence of women horror writers
- Diverse formats—pulp paperbacks, audiobooks, graphic novels




How can I help horror readers?

- May want to read about a particular subject -- zombies or haunted houses
- May want to read everything by favorite authors.
- May want to read across the genre, searching for particular tone or storyline that satisfies
