

Free bookmobile service is available to all residents of our county.

The majority of our stops are individual homes.

We will take the bookmobile to any location we can safely get to and where there is room to park it. If there isn't room at the home, we can arrange a meeting place close by with adequate parking space.

Bookmobile service is requested by calling the library. You can also add a checkbox for bookmobile service on your library card application forms.

HOW TO KEEP UP WITH IT ALL...

These tools helped me (and my patrons) keep up with where I would be ...most of the time.

- Monthly Route Calendar shows which routes on which days – we have 6 bi-weekly routes
- Daily Route Sheet shows me who is on each route and details about each stop
- Reminder Card lets the patron know when the next bookmobile visit is





Monthly Calendar

Copies of the calendar are kept: -on the bookmobile -at the front desk in the library



The Bookmobile route schedule is published/announced:

- -on the library's activity calendar
- -in the local newspaper
- -on the local radio station

Daily Route Sheet

This is for the bookmobile driver's use. I include notes on the back about each customers book preferences, special directions, etc.





Warning...you might start stashing bags and boxes.







Book bags, cube containers, and cardboard boxes are great for carrying books in and out and for holding returns.





Selecting Materials

-Carry a variety of books and movies but tailor your collection to what your customers want. Be open to requests.

-Rotate a large portion of your collection on the bookmobile at least every few months. Especially the children's books at the beginning of summer.

-You will learn your customer's preferences and look out for books they would like. Circulation or cataloging staff can sometimes help.

-Pass your books around amongst customers with similar interests.

-Mark the inside cover of books with patron's initials so you can quickly see if they've had them before.

-Coworkers are excellent resources for readers' advisory assistance, especially for genres with which you are less familiar.

PROMOTING SERVICES & RECRUITING PATRONS

Distribute flyers at local businesses....grocery stores, medical offices, etc.



Take the bookmobile to school events such as open house, literacy night, etc.

Arrange bookmobile tours in the schools. We do tours at preschool and headstart near the end of the school year to promote summer reading.

Make sure the bookmobile is included in your library's promotional info, such as pamphlets, library card application form.

Consider adding a checkbox on your library's card application asking if they're interested in bookmobile services.

Word of mouth is still the best way to get new customers. Ask your patrons if they know of anyone who might be interested.

Participating in local parades is a great way to display your bookmobile and show community involvement.

BOOKMOBILE MAINTENANCE

Be sure to stay up to date on maintenance...oil change, fluids checked, brakes checked, etc.

Check your owner's manual for maintenance schedule recommendations.

Have the phone numbers handy for your mechanic and local towing company.

Walk around your bookmobile to check your tires before each route.


Check tire pressure as the weather changes.



SUPPORT

Interact with bookmobile and outreach staff from other libraries. No one understands your job better than other bookmobilers.

- Attend regional bookmobile & outreach meetings.
- Join KDLA's bookmobile & outreach listserv.
- Attend conferences and training sessions when possible.

RANDOM TIPS

When setting up a new stop, ask if UPS/FedEx can get their trucks there.

Watch for bugs (bedbugs, roaches, lice, etc.) in your returns. Carry large ziploc bags to place contaminated items in. Don't rely on GPS in rural areas! Get detailed directions. Call or text patrons ahead of time if they are really far away or if they have a tendency to not be home.

You will get attached and when you lose patrons it's gonna hurt. Pack snacks and get up and stretch.

Become familiar with places to make restroom stops on your routes. Keep incident report forms on your bookmobile and inform your supervisor/director of any issues you encounter.



In conclusion...

Bookmobile & Outreach Librarians are special people who do an incredibly important job!

Many patrons appreciate the interaction as much as the library materials. Your interactions with them shape their opinions of the library.

Keep up the great work!
