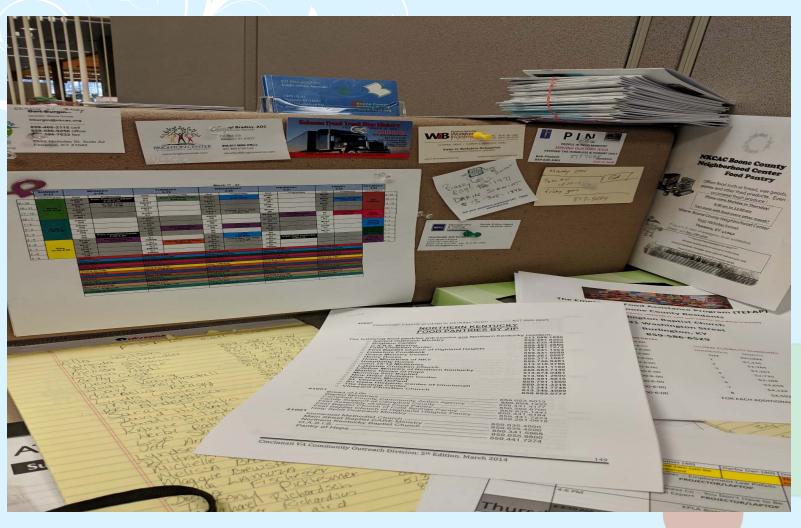

Approaching & Engaging Marginalized Customers

- ✓ Be yourself Regular homeless customers are observing you
- ✓ Treat all customers the same
- ✓ Patrol the library regularly engage with a smile and a nod
- ✓ Treat all customers the same
- ✓ Enforce library rules equitably

Things to consider

- 1. No sleeping in the building, it is a safety issue
- 2. Belongings must be with customers at all times
- 3. Customers can not be under the influence, sell or possess illegal drugs or alcohol on the property
- 4. Scale of enforcement
 - 1st offense for small infraction ex. sleeping warning; larger infraction ex. drugs or violence leave the property or police involvement
 - 2. 2nd offense Leave the property timing based on offense
 - 3. 3rd offense Banned for one week
 - Recurring offenders may have to speak to Branch Manger before returning

- We support the public, providing resources is <u>What We Do</u>
- By assisting we are improving every customer's experience and environment
- Sometimes a 'hand up' is what a customer needs for improving their situation
- By providing resources <u>We Can</u> improve homelessness in our area
