Research Strategies



Objective: specific information wanted



Known Facts: additional information may help



Working Hypothesis: what seems likely?



Identify Sources: types of records, likely repositories, online resources



Planned Steps: start with most likely sources

Searching & Documenting

- Keep detailed notes of all searches, even the unsuccessful ones
- Document everything: photocopy records or keep handwritten notes if necessary
- Stay organized: keep information easy to access

Types of Records

- Vital Records: births, marriages, deaths
- US Census Records: locations of family over time
- Government Records: Land, Probate, Tax, Military, Court, Naturalizations
- Cemetery Records: burial locations
- Other: Church records, newspapers, family records, oral histories...

Vital Records

Births:

- Name
- Race
- Birthplace
- Birthdate
- Parents names & birthplaces

Marriages:

- Names
- Ages
- Marriage date & location
- Parents names, permissions

Deaths:

- Name
- Race
- Birth & death dates
- Location of birth & death
- Cause of death
- Burial information
- Marital status
- Spouse's name

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Marriages

- Exist for most counties since their founding
- KDLA has microfilm copies for most counties; some County Clerks kept records

Births & Deaths


- 1852-1910: at KDLA; records not consistent or complete, varies by county & years
- 1911-present: Office of Vital Statistics; specific requests only, not able to browse
- Deaths 1911-1965: also available at KDLA on microfilm


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Census Records

- Count & description of the population
- Taken every 10 years since 1790
- Easiest way to locate where an ancestor lived at the time
- 1790 & 1800: lost, recreated from tax lists
- 1890: destroyed by fire in 1921
- 1950 Census was released to public in 2022 (72 years)
- KDLA has microfilm
- Ancestry & Family Search: better quality, searchable online





Census Information

- Names, ages, birthplaces: 1850-1950
- Birthplaces of parents: 1880-1950
- Relationships: 1880-1950
- Family & Neighbors: All years
- Immigration Year: 1900-1930
- Citizenship: 1910-1940

Land Records

- Deeds: a record is created each time property was transferred
 - Exist for most counties since their founding
 - Recorded in County Clerk for county where land was located
 - NOTE! As new counties were formed or boundaries changed, older records <u>stayed</u> in the parent county
- Land Grants: issued by government for military service or cash payments
 - Secretary of State Land Office has indexes & original records
 - KDLA has copies for most records on microfilm

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Probate Records

- Search multiple books & records; not usually collected into a single file (until 1978)
 - Wills
 - Estate Settlements
 - Inventories & Appraisements
 - Guardianships
 - Court Cases, if settlement was contested

Tax Records

- Tax lists serve similar purpose as a census
- Help follow families between census years, or as alternative to missing years
- Owned property, militia volunteer, etc.
- Poll taxes: paid yearly by white males age 21+ for privilege of voting

Military Records

- Compiled service records
- Adjutant General Reports
- Pension records
- Bounty land records
- KDLA has some records, depending on the conflict

Court Records

- Legal activities through life
- Divorce, civil disputes, criminal charges
- Relationships, character information, financial & business information, held court position
- Most records still in original form



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Immigration & Naturalization

- Pre-1790: no federal laws, VA laws applied to KY
 - 1779: VA granted citizenship to any white individual born in territory & all living there for more than 2 years
 - 1783: must appear before a court to attain citizenship
- 1790-1906: federal naturalization act
 - immigrants generally eligible for naturalization after 5 years
 - Process handled in <u>any</u> court (city, county, state, or federal)
- 1906-present: federal naturalization process established
 - Still occurred in nonfederal courts, but documentation must be submitted to Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization
 - 1940-present: only federal district courts can grant citizenship

Immigration & Naturalization

- Not all immigrants completed citizenship
- Men were primary applicants for most early records
 - Children inherited citizenship of father
 - Women received citizenship from husband's status, even if they were US citizens already
 - 1922: Married Women's Act (Cable Act) granted women a nationality of their own, independent of her husband

Cemetery Records

- Headstone inscriptions
- Written records: information recorded by cemetery officials/caretakers
- May provide information on:
 - Deceased name, birth & death dates, related persons, military service, religion, occupation, marriage information or maiden name, etc.

Church Records

- Baptisms, Marriages, Burials
- Especially helpful if unable to locate official records
- Membership Lists
- Church History
- Will vary depending on denomination, activity, etc.

Newspapers

- Obituaries
- Court notices & reports
- Announcements
- Community involvement




