
The Germans have broken their pledged word and devastated Belgium. Help to keep your Country's honour bright by restoring Belgium her liberty.

do declare that I am a resident of the State of Kentucky and the county of Christian; that I am 16 years of age; that my occupation is that of Student; that I do not now belong to any other organization in the Kentucky State Guard nor have I ever been discharged from the State Guard for disability or by sentence of Court martial, and that I know of no impediment to my becoming a member of the State Guard according to law. And I solemnly promise and agree that I will honestly and faithfully serve the State of Kentucky, and that I will do my utmost to support the Constitution and Laws of the United States and of the State of Kentucky against all violence of whatsoever kind or description, and I further declare that I will well and truly execute and obey the lawful orders of all officers legally placed over me when on duty.

SKETCH OF THE MADISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY CHAPTER AMERICAN RED CROSS .

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In response to a call written by Miss Lucia Field Burnam, which had been read from the several pulpits of the city on the preceding Sabbath, sixty-eight women assembled in the Sunday School rooms of the Christian Church, Richmond, Kentucky, May 10, 1917, to express their interest in the Red Cross movement. Three Red Cross workers from the neighboring city of Lexington, where a chapter had already been established, were present to give instruction and counsel in the mode of procedure.

It was quickly decided that a chapter to be called the Madison County, Kentucky Chapter, A.R.C., should be organized, and most of those present paid their dues.

Within a few days the names of the following petitioners were forwarded to the Chicago Headquarters, and then to Washington.

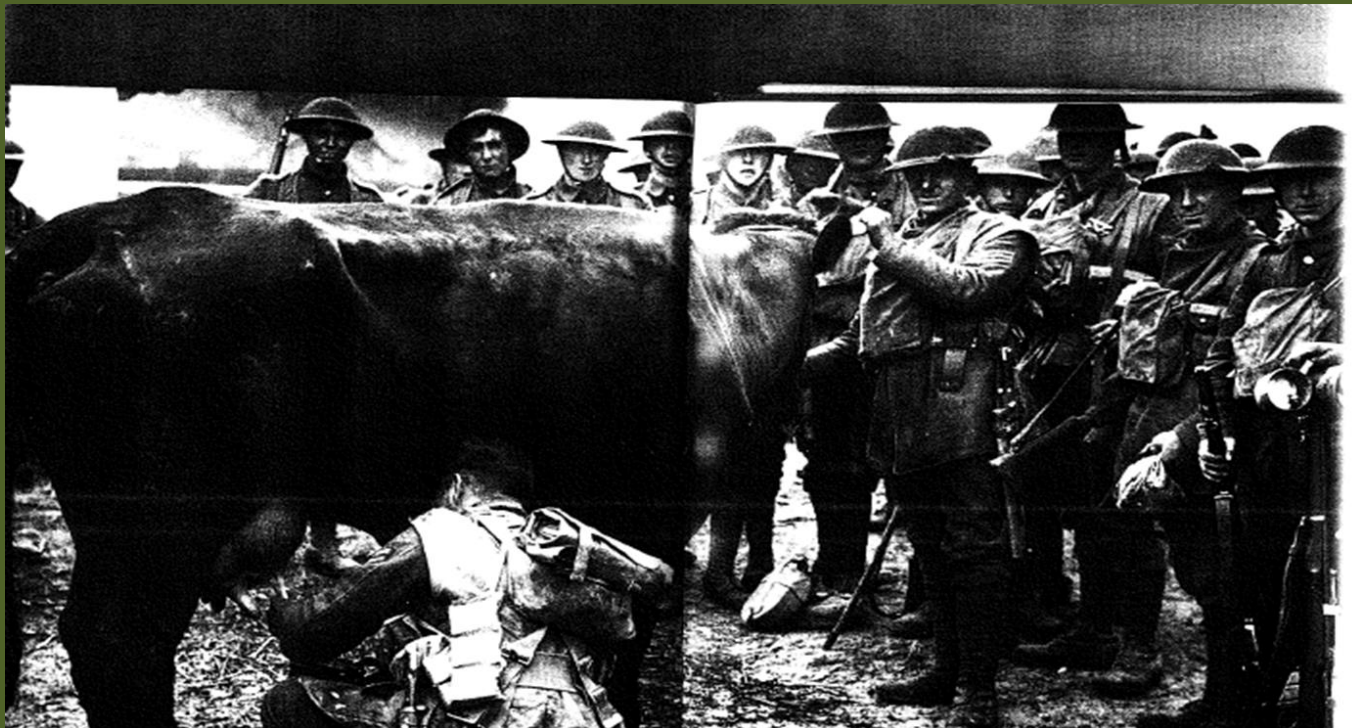
