- We get to socialize and just hang out in our club.
- We usually have about 25 patrons that show up for the Adult Activity Hour.

Special Needs Programming during Covid-19

- Offering Zoom interactions with our patrons.
- . I ask what they want to read.
- At the end of the program, they can talk about what's on their minds.
- I make sure I check with the Special Needs contacts and see how they are doing.
- Make sure to have a familiar face and routine of the "old way" of doing things.
