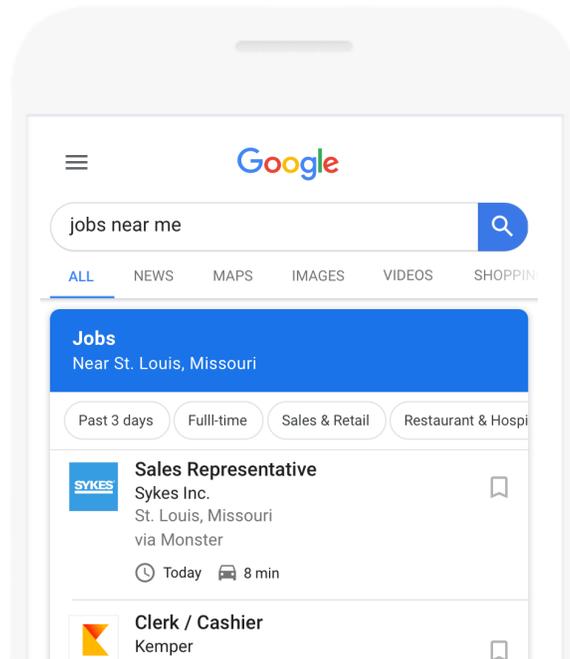

## Tips to get started with jobs on Google Search

### Search phrases relevant to you.

Try “jobs near me,” “teaching jobs,” or similar job phrases on Google, and you’ll be able to explore jobs all in one place.

### Filter by location.

See jobs in areas that are convenient for you. If you’re signed in, you may even see how long it would take to commute to a job from your home.

### Keep on top of your job hunt with alerts.

Receive email notifications when new jobs that match your search specifications are posted.

### Make more informed choices.

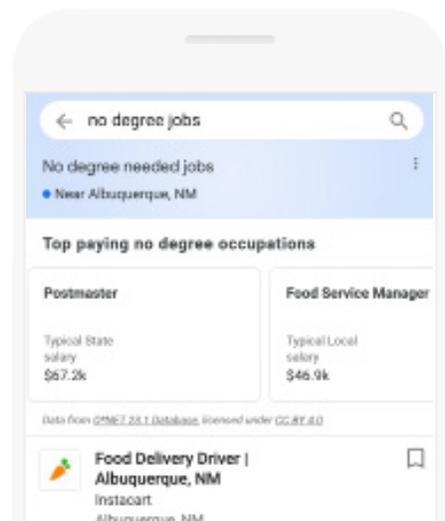
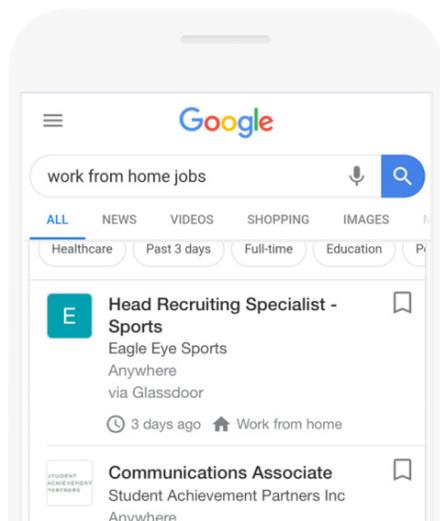
Remember to keep an eye out for salary information and employer reviews.

## Find a job you can take anywhere

You can now apply a ‘work from home’ location filter to job searches on Google to help you find remote work opportunities. To get started, search “work from home jobs” on Google to surface remote work job listings across industries.

## Find a job that doesn’t require a degree

When you search for “no degree jobs” in the U.S., you’ll see a job carousel highlighting relevant opportunities near you. Additionally, on any job-related search, you can filter by education and experience requirements, and there will be labels on positions that do not mention degrees in their requirements.
