Public libraries in 113 of Kentucky's counties provide wireless access (Wi-Fi) for patrons.

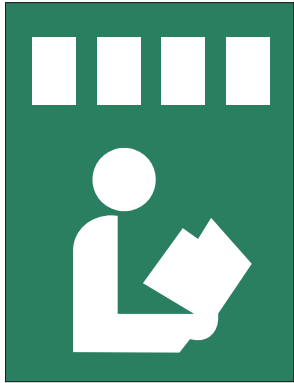

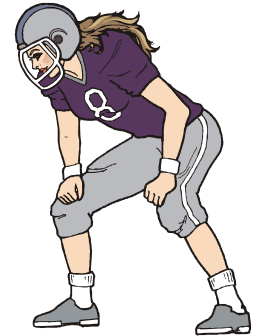
