# GLOSSARY

## **ALA-MLS**

Librarians with master's degrees from programs of library and information studies accredited by the American Library Association.

## **Annual Public Service Hours**

Sum of all public service hours for all central libraries, branches, and bookmobiles. Includes limited occupancy.

## **Book Turnover**

Total book circulation divided by total book collection.

## **Bookmobile**

A large vehicle outfitted with an organized collection of library materials, paid staff, and regularly scheduled public hours (bookmobile stops).

## **Branch Library**

Auxiliary unit of an administrative entity which has all the following: (1) separate quarters, (2) an organized collection of library materials, (3) paid staff, and (4) regularly scheduled hours for being open to the public.

## **Budget Expenditures**

The sum of costs for collection, personnel, and operations.

## **Capital Expenditures**

Major capital expenditures (acquisition of or additions to fixed assets). Examples include expenditures for (a) site acquisitions; (b) new buildings; (c) additions to or renovation of library buildings; (d) furnishings, equipment, and initial book stock for new buildings, building additions, or building renovations; (e) library automation systems; (f) new vehicles; and (g) other one-time major projects.

## **Capital Revenue**

Revenue to be used for major capital expenditures. Examples include funds received for a) site acquisition; b) new buildings; c) additions to or renovation of library buildings; d) furnishings, equipment, and initial book stock for new buildings, building additions, or building renovations; e) library automation systems; f) new vehicles; and g) and other one-time major projects.

## **Children's Program Attendance**

The count of the audience at all programs for which the primary audience is children 11 years and under. Includes adults who attend programs intended primarily for children.

## **Circulation**

Materials in all formats that are checked out for use outside the library, including renewals.

# GLOSSARY

## **Electronic Books (E-Books)**

Digital documents (including those digitized by the library), licensed or not, where searchable text is prevalent, and which can be seen in analogy to a printed book (monograph). Includes non-serial government documents. E-books are loaned to users on portable devices (e-book readers) or by transmitting the contents to the user's personal computer for a limited time.

## **Electronic Materials**

Materials that are distributed digitally and can be accessed via computer, Internet, or portable device (e.g., e-book reader). Examples include e-books and downloadable electronic video and audio files.

## **FTE (Full Time Equivalent)**

To ensure comparable national data, the following calculation for budgeted positions is used:  
*Hours worked by employees in a position / 40*

## **General Operating Expenditures**

Library costs, including supplies, rent, fees, building maintenance, postage, etc.

## **Intellectual Freedom Challenges**

An intellectual freedom challenge is an attempt to restrict or censor library materials, programs, or events that may be perceived as controversial or politically sensitive.

## **Local Government Revenue**

Local government funds designated by the community, district, or region and available for expenditure by the public library. Does not include the value of any contributed or in-kind services, or the value of any gifts and donations, library fines, fees or grants.

## **Material Circulated, Main Library**

Total material circulated in main library only (not including branch library or bookmobile circulation).

## **Material Circulation Per Capita**

The sum of all material circulated for the central library, branches, and bookmobiles, divided by population.

## **Other Operating Revenue**

Operating revenue other than that reported under local, state, and federal.

## **People Entering Library**

The total number of people entering the library for any purpose during the year.

## **Physical Units, Audio and Video**

Tangible objects that can be held, shelved, and circulated. For audio and video materials, this means the actual physical object the content is stored on (e.g., Blu-ray disc, DVD, vinyl record, audiobook cartridge).

## GLOSSARY

### **Population**

The latest county population estimates as released by the Kentucky Data Center.

### **Reference Transaction**

An information contact which involves the knowledge, use, recommendations, interpretation, or instruction in the use of one or more information sources by a member of the library staff.

### **Total Electronic Access Costs**

All expenditures for computer hardware and software used to support library operations, whether purchased or leased, and expenditures for maintenance and for equipment used to run information service products when that expenditure can be separated from the price of the product.

### **Total Library Staff**

Sum of total librarians and all other paid staff funded in the library's budget, expressed as FTE.

### **Total Material Circulated**

Total of all material circulated by the main library, branches, and bookmobiles.

### **Total Operating Expenditures**

Sum of local, state, federal, and other operating revenue.

Total funds used for staff salaries and benefits.
