## TeachingBooks Available to Every Kentuckian

KDLA now offers free statewide access to <u>TeachingBooks</u>, a website that helps library workers find educational resources for over 97,000 children's and teen books. Among the 372,000 resources available, library staff will find games and puzzles, programming resources, Summer Reading Program support, a custom reading list builder, and ideas for promoting the books in your collection. TeachingBooks also has sections to support homeschooling families, offer homework help for young readers, and provide collection analysis tools.

TeachingBooks resources are available in 20 languages and integrate seamlessly with the Libby app. For librarians whose job focuses on early childhood, TeachingBooks recently launched the Early Literacy Toolkit. This toolkit contains curated lists of PreK-2 titles, meet-the-author or illustrator videos, and provides fun ideas to ensure your programs support skills that make up the Scarborough Reading Rope.
