



The deepest lake in Kentucky at 249 feet, Herrington Lake was formed in 1925 with the installation of the Dix Dam.




LESLIE COUNTY, 1939 A necessity for any holler, creeks form a core part of life in Eastern Kentucky.

One of 42 man-made lakes in the state, Kentucky Lake was created in 1944 with the installation of the Kentucky Dam. It is the largest artificial lake by surface area east of the Mississippi River.
