We've had many questions about the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) and how its funding impacts our services.

KTBL is a member library of the National Library Service for the Blind and Print Disabled, part of the Library of Congress. We are grateful for the materials, support, and BARD access they provide. Operations at KTBL, including staff salaries, select studio services, and funding for

some outreach activities are provided by grants from IMLS through the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA).

More than 20% of KTBL's funding comes via LSTA grants from IMLS. This is in addition to state match funds and the generous donations of our users throughout Kentucky. This funding helps KTBL serve our more than 3,800 Kentuckians, 87% of which say they would not have access to audio or braille materials without us. In 2024 alone, we circulated more than 240,000 items in audio and braille formats.

In the past ten years, KTBL has uploaded more than 600 books recorded at our in-house studio about the people, places, and history of Kentucky to BARD Mobile, allowing people from across the country to share in the rich tapestry of Kentucky life.

#### KTBL TESTING LATEST TALKING BOOK MACHINE



We've been prepping for it for awhile now, and the wait is almost over!

NLS has begun rolling out small numbers of their new digital talking book machine, the DA-2, to libraries across the country. That includes us here at KTBL!

We have received our demonstration unit and will be testing it out over the next few weeks as we prepare to receive our first shipment of approximately 200 machines.
