The Line of Fire!

Demonstrates hazardous and dangerous situations in the workplace and how to prevent them. Includes situations involving moving objects, machinery, flying debris, chemicals, electrical switches. Stresses safety measures and protective gear.

The Newcomers

Office Injury Prevention

Stresses the importance of a good safety attitude in preventing office injuries. Covers housekeeping; slips, trips, and falls; lifting; ergonomics; hygiene; and, emergency response.

Office Safety: It's a Jungle Out There

Pro-active Safety Attitudes: Looking out for Number One

Forces workers to take responsibility for safety and teaches them how to take a pro-active approach by recognizing hazards before they become accidents. Originally produced in English, dubbed into Spanish and Portuguese.

Responsibility: Who's in Control

Shows a series of vignettes where worker's unsafe actions put themselves or others in jeopardy. Asks the viewer, "Who is in control -- time, emotions, or other people?" Stresses that workers should ask themselves "Am I thinking about what I'm doing? Am I working safely? And what are my choices?"
