- Overseen by a twelve member appointed board and at least eleven advisors.
- Fosters statewide oral history documentation through granting programs and outreach.
- Supports and serves as a unifying influence for oral history programs and archives throughout the Commonwealth.





What is an oral history?

A recorded dialogue between two people that captures personal memories of historic significance.

Support for Collecting Oral Histories

- Technical Assistance
 - Equipment loan
 - Training
- Project Grant
 - Up to 7,500 with 1:1 match
 - \$100 per interview hour
 - Travel, supplies, equipment, etc.











Support for Making Oral Histories Accessible





- Transcription and Indexing Grant
 - Up to \$5,000
 - \$120 per interview hour transcribe
 - \$40 per interview hour index
- Presentation Grant
 - Up to \$2,500 with 1:1 match
 - Funds exhibits, podcasts, online media
 - Personnel, fees, supplies, travel, marketing, etc.









Support for Archives

- Preservation Assistance
 - Equipment loan
 - Training
- Preservation Grant
 - Up to \$3,500
 - costs for producing a digital copy
- Archival Accreditation












Other Opportunities



- Special Collecting Initiatives
 - Requests for single interviews around a topic or theme
 - Low-barrier proposal requirements
 - Possible stipend or honorarium
- Oral History Workshops
 - 90+ min. introduction to conducting oral histories








