
Aging

- "Between 2015 and 2050, the proportion of the world's population over 60 years will nearly double from 12% to 22%."
- 250% increase in less developed countries

•71% in more...

Dementia

- 2015 47.5 million with dementia
- •2050 135.5 million






Creativity Center

ALA Tips

- Choose the best approaches for **your community**.
- Establish an **advisory group** with elders and service providers.
- Invite people to informal focus groups where you can pick their brains for good ideas. Conduct simple surveys with both library regulars and non-users.
- Sponsor community forums on hot topics with elders.
- Invite key seniors to review plans and offer suggestions.
- Staff projects with **older adult volunteers.**

TS Tips


- Research existing cultural/educational services in your area.
