




















# DEEP SEA DIVING: BUOYANCY

- <u>http://www.startwithabook.org/content/pdfs/DeepSeaDiver.pdf</u>
- Show participants a group of objects and ask them to predict which will sink and which will float. Then, test their ideas using a plastic container filled with water.
- Have small groups of participants build a small diver (no larger than 3 in. x 3 in.) that is neutrally buoyant.
- Place the diver into a container of water and test its buoyancy.





- Goal: To build awareness of how we see and use water

- Discuss ways to conserve water




















### MAKE A CINQUAIN

Line 2: Two adjectives that describe your topic


Line 3: Three "ing" verbs that describe action


### TWITTER TALES


### MYTHS AND LEGENDS
