- SF or Sci-Fi
- Speculative Fiction
- Science Fiction is often confused with or considered the same as Fantasy
- Science Fiction is what could happen or theoretically happen in our universe
- Explores the question of "what if"




- Settings in outer space, on another world, or in the future or past.
- Characters include beings, such as aliens, mutants and robots
- Futuristic technology and scientific principles
- Paranormal abilities
- Dystopian or post-apocalyptic social or political systems
- Other universes or dimensions and travel between them.




Appeal of Science Fiction

### History of Science Fiction


- Late 1930s and 1940s

     Heinlein, Arthur C. Clarke, Ray Bradbury and Stanislaw Lem




### History of Science Fiction 1950s and 1960s Space exploration and aliens Monster stories appeared regularly in magazines Shift from hard sciences to soft sciences














### Soft Science Fiction

- Mary Doria Russell—The Sparrow, Children of God






### **Aliens-First Contact**
