#### TRAVELERS AND RESOURCES


- Get Information: advice from others (crowdsourced option i.e.
   Trip Advisor) or "experts" with authority (guidebooks like
   Fodor's, etc.).
- Consult many resources in various formats so it is important to have print, eBooks, apps, websites, etc.
- Therefore a balancing act in publishing (and in the library too)
   between high quality print and digital resources.
- Resources at the library are a good way for would-be travelers to explore destinations.



#### PRINT STILL POPULAR



- Fodor's series
- Frommer's-somewhat more focused on the budget traveler; focus on needs of older travelers
- Rick Steves-focus is on a few, but trip-worthy locations, mainly in Europe & Andy Steves for the 20 somethings.
- Lonely Planet & LP Kids-the "standard" for a solid guidebook; covers most countries in Europe, Asia, Africa, & the Americas; low to mid budgets; good travel tips; new "Blow Your Mind" series
- Let's Go-written by Harvard students for young train travelers on a tight budget
- DK's Eyewitness Travel-good visual guides and good for pre-trip planning, but very little written information.
   Revamped in 2016.



#### PRINT CONTINUED

- Rough Guides-British series written by Europeans; not good as a hotel guide, but has good sightseeing information.
- Michelin Guides-1. Green-color maps & photos with some written information; 2. Red-hotel and restaurant aficionado's Bible
- Blue Guides-scholarly and dry in approach, but in-depth about history, art, culture, etc.
- Time Out-cover many European cities and several British regions; written with a British market in mind and an insider's savvy.
- National Geographic




