Boone County - by the numbers

- More youth registered 9788
- More youth reached goal one 3433
- More youth reached goal two 2526
- More youth participation at child care and summer camps – 3,297
- We saw an increase in overall registered number for people birth to adults – 171% (from previous year)




SR Challenges with Boone County Schools – Why We Partnered

- 14 elementary schools in Boone county
- Each school with their own SR program
- Coordination becomes impossible
- Families overwhelmed and confused

Meeting With the Principals

- In September 2014, we invited the elementary public school principals to meet with us
- We proposed ONE combined Summer Reading program
- We asked "What do you want to measure?"
 - Minutes read
 - Pages read
 - Books read




2015 Boone County Summer Reading Program

- Summer Reading began MAY 9TH.
 - Read anything you like!
 - Record the time you spend reading
 - 2015 theme: "What's Your Superpower?"
- Ended AUGUST 28 after school began







New Idea – Register in the schools


- Register students in the school before it lets out for summer
- Assign each school a BCPL rep for each of the 14 public elementary schools





School Support

- BCPL ran and sent periodic reports of student participation for the schools
- Staff participated in summer check-in events at several schools
- Offered to distribute prizes at schools in the Fall



2015 BC Summer Reading Results

- Schools were ranked based on
 - the number of total minutes read
 - the number of minutes read per enrolled student
 - the number of minutes read per registered student
- The winning school did not register in school, but sent their students to the library

They received a travelling trophy from the district

Erpenbeck got 100% of their students to register at the library and they had the highest average of minutes read per student enrolled at their school.

What is the desired outcome of a SR program?


- Our goal is to see NO loss in reading level from the Spring 15 STAR test compared to the Fall 15 STAR test
- We will determine a baseline based on this year's statistics

Measurement & Analysis

Measurement: Compare Spring/Fall STAR tests


Analysis of these actions:

- Registering for SR
- Reading 5 hours (goal one)
- Reading 10 hours (goal two)




One Book, One Summer (OBOS)

- First summer was 2014
- Modeled from "One Book, One Community"
- Feedback from schools was to pick one book for each grade



OBOS - 2014

- This was the first step towards our partnership
- Some schools provided books for their students
- The library purchased 75 copies of each title



OBOS - 2015

- What did we do differently?
 - We invited/involved the librarians and PTO parent representatives
 - Monthly meetings with school librarians, parents, & library staff
 - Selection and voting stages

The results were fantastic!
