Alternative comics

A novel in comic form

Several issues of a comic combined in one volume

Writer: Responsible for story, both plot and dialogue.

Penciler: Draws images
Inker: Enhances images
Colorist: Adds color to images
Letterer: Adds word balloons, captions, and sound effects

Editor: Oversees production of a comic

Universe: An imagined world/timeline/reality in which a story exists

Cannon: The "official" timeline, events, etc. in a universe

Event:

Crossover: When a character appears in another character's series

Fanboy/girl: Someone who takes their comic book fandom seriously
