From July 1976 to July 1986, index information was recorded on 3x5 cards. In August 1986, the Supreme Court instituted the Appellate Court Case Processing System (03653 - Supreme Court Schedule), from which index information is now created.

Rete	ention and Disposition	Retain permanently in agency. NOTE: A copy of the index must accompany Case Files (03814) when transferred to the State Archives Archives Center.
	Docket Sheets (ACCPS Printout)	This series documents, in summary form, the proceedings in cases appearing before the Court of Appeals. Dockets are prepared by the Clerk for use by the Court and the Bar. It also serves as a security backup to the Case Files (03814), in the event of their loss, damage, or theft. From July 1976 to July 1986, the series was created and maintained manually. From August 1986 to the present, the series is created and maintained in the Appellate Court Case Processing System (03653), as listed on the Supreme Court Schedule. * Note: Docket Sheets prior to August 1986 are filed within the case files. After that time, they are maintained separate.

03814	Case Files (V)	This series documents the procedures and opinions of the Court of Appeals, in relation to judgments rendered by lower courts. Except as provided in section 110 of the Constitution of Kentucky, an appeal may be taken as a matter of right to the Court of Appeals from any conviction, final judgment, order, or decree rendered on an appeal from a court inferior to circuit court. The Court of Appeals has jurisdiction to review interlocutory orders of the circuit court in civil cases but, there shall be no review by appeal or by writ of certiorari from that portion of a final judgment, order, or decree of a circuit court dissolving a marriage. An appeal may be taken to the Court of Appeals by the state in criminal cases from an adverse decision on ruling of the circuit court, but only under the following conditions: 1) such an appeal shall not suspend the proceedings in the case; 2) the record on appeal shall be transmitted by the Clerk of the Circuit Court to the Attorney General. If the Attorney General is satisfied that review of the Court of Appeals is important, he may deliver the record to the Clerk of the Court of Appeals; 3) Court of Appeals may reverse the decision of the circuit court and order a new trial in any case in which a new trial would not constitute double jeopardy or otherwise violate any constitutional rights of the defendant. * Note: 705 rolls

It also indicates whether or not decisions are to be published in law books.
